

Spring Actions and Egg Hunt

Learn and act out Spring action-words!

Goal(s) Addressed

Student will use visual scanning to locate objects

Student will be able to imitate actions demonstrated by teacher or peers

Student will engage in pretend play to act as animals and objects

Materials Needed

- 1. 16 Plastic eggs
- 2. 16 Action cards
- 3. Timer



Layout

How should the room look? Where are the student's placed? When will this be taught?

- This will be taught during warm ups.
- Students will be seated in the middle of the room.
- Eggs will be placed throughout the room.

Activity

Describe each step in detail. Include key vocabulary.

- 1. Prepare the eggs. Cut out each action card. Place an action card into each egg.
- 2. Place the eggs throughout the room. They can be easily seen or out of sight.
- 3. Tell the students that they will have 2 minutes to collect 2 eggs. Set a timer for 2 minutes.
- 4. When the timer goes off, students will return to their seats.
- 5. Students will take turns to open their egg. Read the action card for all students and model the action.
- 6. All students will imitate the action.
- 7. Repeat until all students have opened their first egg.
- 8. Repeat until all students have opened their second egg.



Accommodations/Modifications/Adaptations

How can this lesson be adapted by kids with special needs?

- Use gestural prompts to help student find eggs
- Use hand-over-hand prompts to help student perform desired stretch if unable to do so physically
- Decrease action time for students with shorter attention spans
- Instead of modelling action for students, allow student to interpret and model action for peers
