

When sneezing is pleasing!

Show students how many germs come from a sneeze and how we can prevent the spread!

Goal(s) Addressed

Student will be able to imitate poses demonstrated by teacher or peers Student will work on crossing midline of his/her body

Materials Needed (Including Song if applicable)

1. Scarves

How should the room look? Where are the student's placed? When will this be taught?

- Students are on their carpet squares against the mirror.
- o Each student has their own scarf.

Activity

Describe each step in detail. Include key vocabulary.



- 1. Each student is on their carpet square and a teacher distributes scarves.
- 2. Students place scarves on their heads.
- 3. Teacher says "Ah" "Ah-choo!" and students follow along.
- 4. With the "achoo," teacher and students sneeze their scarves into their laps.
- 5. Teacher explains how the scarves are the germs from their sneeze.
- 6. The activity is repeated except the teacher has the students "sneeze" their scarves into their elbows to prevent the spread of germs.



Accommodations/Modifications/AdaptationsHow can this lesson be adapted by kids with special needs?

- Students will follow the teacher's instructions and imitate movements.
- If scarves are not available, tissues can be used also.
